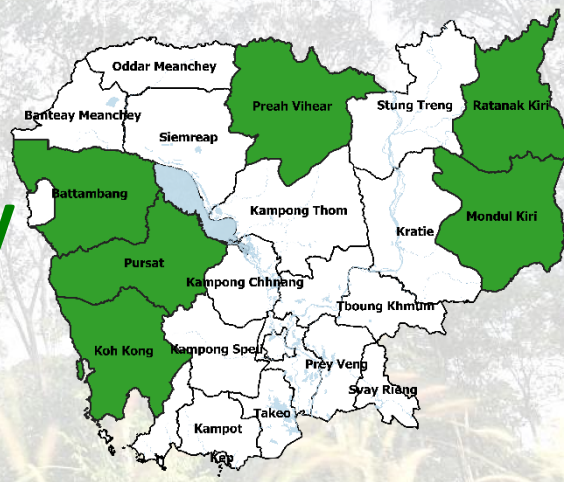


Civil Society Support Activity Cluster Anchor Grants



OVERVIEW

The merging of the different scopes and approaches of all cluster members – Open Development Cambodia (ODC), CamboJA, Converse Indigenous Peoples Languages (CIPL), and Young Eco Ambassador (YEA) - consolidates a comprehensive outreach at both local and national levels.

The proposed cluster seeks to make natural resource management more sustainable, inclusive and participatory, integrating the needs and concerns of indigenous peoples. The project stems from the lack of transparency and participatory decision-making and monitoring processes regarding natural resource management, environmental protection, and the marginalized and vulnerable position of Indigenous Peoples in such processes.

OBJECTIVES



1. Improve access to meaningful and reliable natural resource management and environmental protection data

Serves to keep construction enterprises and the government accountable as well as to report the issues faced by indigenous communities.



2. Mobilize indigenous communities

Improve communication mechanisms between indigenous peoples and local authorities and supporting them to actively participate in public decision-making at the sub-national level.



3. Advance on natural resource management at the national level

Forge strategic alliances with key cross-sectoral stakeholders, ensuring that the views of indigenous peoples are effectively reflected.
