ABOUT THE EXHIBITION

On 10th December 2023, Climate Change Data Art Exhibition took place at Prayuters Library Program in Hmor Seth village, Sangkat Pal Hal, Krong Preah Vihear, Preah Vihear province. A total of 49 participants, comprising students, teachers, village chiefs, commune chiefs, and ODC teams were in attendance. The primary objective of the exhibition was to enhance awareness among students, educators, and local authorities concerning the intricacies of climate change and its consequential impacts.

The event was organized by Prayuters Library in collaboration with Open Development Cambodia (ODC), with funding support from **HBS Cambodia** and **USAID** through **FHI360**.

BACKGROUND

The event was organized to help students, teachers, and local authorities understand more about climate change and its effects. The event coincided with the 28th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP28)^[1], where the world assessed progress in the Paris Agreement. COP28 focuses on four big changes: speeding up the switch to cleaner energy, reducing emissions by 2030, changing how climate finance is transforming, putting nature and people at the center of our efforts, and making COP28 the most inclusive summit ever. Raising awareness of climate change in the community and among students is fully aligned with the goals of COP28. By fostering understanding and engagement at the local level, it contributes to building support for global efforts to address climate challenges. Empowering students with knowledge and a sense of responsibility aligns with COP28's aim to create a more sustainable and resilient future, as they represent the future leaders who will be impacted by current climate policies. Overall, community and student awareness activities complement the broader objectives of COP28 in addressing and mitigating the impacts of climate change.

The event aimed to make the climate change-related topic clear and inspire everyone to act in the face of climate change. The event began with a concise presentation addressing climate change concerns specific to Cambodia, led by environmental expert Chanthong Borm. The Mr. Chanthong elucidated and assessed pivotal issues and challenges within the Cambodian context, with the proceedings visually captured through sketch notes by artist Moeu Diyadaravuth. Time was allowed for allowing for inquiries and responses about climate change and environmental matters from the students. After this initial presentation, participating students engaged in a sketch session titled "Impressions of Climate Change," aimed at conceptualizing artistic representations of challenges and opportunities for climate change mitigation. Guided by two artist practitioners from Cicada arts network, (Mr. Chhoem Hay and Son Kosal) students explored the creative process. Following the sketch session, students were invited to present their artwork briefly and articulate a title for their creations.

The artworks were digitally scanned for subsequent display in a month-long exhibition at Prayuters Library. This exhibition was strategically designed to foster heightened awareness and encourage civic involvement in climate change mitigation activities. The sketch notes and artwork will be then disseminated through various channels on the ODC platforms.

Climate Change Overview

The overview on climate change was delivered by our distinguished expert, Mr. Chanthong Bormy, a Spatial Database Specialist. Mr. Bormy precisely explained the causes of climate change and its consequences on both livelihoods and the environment. Alongside this, he illustrated identified solutions and mitigation strategies. The subsequent sketch note, an artistic combination of the presentation, and the engaged participation of the attendees serve as a visual representation of the collective interests and passions exhibited by the audience during the discourse. This visual documentation captures not only the challenges of climate change but also the engagement of those present in the room.

Social Media Promotion




