

Response to COVID

- Technical assistance for designing and implementing the COVID cash transfer benefiting **775,000 poor households** for 3 years.
- Procurement of **USD 25 million** medical supplies and equipment.
- 7 hospitals (3 in Phnom Penh, 4 in provinces) received equipment and training on **infectious waste management**.
- **1,520 MSMEs** assisted in adopting e-commerce for business continuity.

Mine action

- **143.5 km²** cleared from landmines, equivalent to 14% of the total surface area released by the sector.
- **283,532 persons** (49% women) using the released safe land, generating over USD 5.6 million in additional agricultural income.

Innovation

- **AI** is deployed to map multidimensional vulnerability.
- A blockchain technology, the **Universal Trusted Credentials (UTC)**, being deployed as an alternative mechanism to collateral-based financing for access to finance and accelerating formalisation.
- A **National Foresight Roadmap** leveraging the application of AI for strategic policymaking.

Support for legal and regulatory frameworks

- Over 15 laws, strategies and global reports directly supported.

Social Protection

- Registration of **1.78 million at-risk people** made possible by the enhanced IDPoor targeting methodology and system digitalisation for access to social protection.
- **Over 350,000 informal workers** registered in the self-employed social security scheme supported in 2024.
- **12,500 people** benefited from the **graduation-based social protection** pilot, moving them from assistance to productivity, and informing the design of the national program.

Inclusive growth

- UNDP unlocked **USD 2.88 billion** through public and private sources for development financing (ref. Page 2).
- Assessment of **LDC** graduation impacts used to defer it to 2029 for better preparedness.
- **Gender Wage Gap** analysis for enhancing gender parity.
- Cambodia's **SDG Investor Map** for private investment in the SDGs.
- Policy and sector analyses defined **formalisation** paths and informed the 2023 national policy.

Leaving No One Behind

- Technical assistance expanded **IDPoor registration** and **social assistance** to:
 - 493,800 at-risk households affected by flood and inflation received cash transfers and other social benefits in 2022 and 2023.
 - 395,322 women-headed households.
 - 87,800 persons with disabilities.
 - 47,718 People Living with HIV.
- **10,970 Indigenous People** benefited from sustainable livelihoods, communal land registration, and sustainable natural resource management.

Disaster Risk Management

- **146 officials** trained in using flood models and GIS systems for proactive preparedness for disaster response at the provincial level.
- Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation plans were implemented in 10 communes to boost their **preparedness and emergency response**.

Climate Change, Environmental Sustainability and Circular Economy

- **105,000 hectares** of forest sustainably managed by communities, providing 60,000 people with nature-based livelihoods.
- **3,000 tons of plastic collected** as part of innovation challenges.
- **5,200 people** living in insular and remote areas gained access to clean energy through solar mini-grids.
- **9,400 smallholder** farmers accessed solar-powered water for irrigation.
- The launch of the first **central, online, spatial environmental management system (CEMIS)** with an inbuilt AI feature.
- **Support the national climate agenda**, such as the Long-Term Strategy for Carbon Neutrality (2021); the first and second Cambodia Climate Change Strategic Plan 2024–2033 (2025), NDCs update, and reporting on international engagements.

Strong and inclusive institutions

- Digital platforms (yobol.org) collected over **1,600 citizen feedback** on local public services in 2025.
- **739 participants** in provincial dialogues on SDG localisation and participatory governance improved coordination between local authorities and their constituency and the implementation of small impact projects (ex. Kampot drainage).

Top Core Contributors

Core funds are flexible, regular resources that are not earmarked for a specific project or theme.



USD 2.88 billion unlocked through public and private financing

- **USD 1.06 billion** in national budget aligned with SDG 13 by applying climate-sensitive budgeting guidelines for infrastructure investments (Climate Change Marker/ Climate Public Expenditure Reviews)
- **USD 2.87 billion** new resources leveraged for the SDGs
 - **USD 1.54 billion** national budget allocated for social assistance.
 - **USD 146 million** mobilised by issuing the first Khmer Riel bond.
 - **USD 100 million** public resources earmarked for the **National Strategy on Informal Economy 2023–2028**.
 - **USD 25 million** earned through **carbon financing (REDD+)**.
 - **USD 9.6 million** private finance accessed by **women-owned MSMEs** through the CGCC guarantee scheme.
