Social Protection

Registration of 1.78 million at-risk people made possible by the enhanced IDPoor targeting methodology and system digitalisation for access to social protection.

- Over 350,000 informal workers registered in the self-employed social security scheme supported in 2024.
- 12,500 people benefited from the graduation-based **social protection** pilot, moving them from assistance to productivity, and informing the design of the national program.



Disaster Risk Management

- 146 officials trained in using flood models and GIS systems for proactive preparedness for disaster response at the provincial level.
- Disaster Risk Reduction and Climate Change Adaptation plans were implemented in 10 communes to boost their preparedness and emergency response.





Strong and inclusive institutions

- Digital platforms (yobol.org) collected over 1,600 citizen feedback on local public services in 2025.
- localisation and participatory governance improved coordination between local authorities and their constituency and the implementation of small impact projects (ex. Kampot drainage).


- UNDP unlocked **USD 2.88 billion** through public and private sources for development financing (ref. Page 2).
- Assessment of **LDC** graduation impacts used to defer it to 2029 for better preparedness.
- **Gender Wage Gap** analysis for enhancing gender parity.
- Cambodia's **SDG Investor Map** for private investment in the SDGs.
- Policy and sector analyses defined **formalisation** paths and informed the 2023 national policy.

 - received cash transfers and other social benefits in 2022 and 2023.



USD 2.88 billion unlocked through public and private financing

- USD 1.06 billion in national budget aligned with SDG 13 by applying climate-sensitive budgeting guidelines for infrastructure investments (Climate Change Marker/ Climate Public Expenditure Reviews)
- USD 2.87 billion new resources leveraged for the SDGs
 - o **USD 1.54 billion** national budget allocated for social assistance.
 - o **USD 146 million** mobilised by issuing the first Khmer Riel bond.
 - USD 100 million public resources earmarked for the National Strategy on Informal Economy 2023–2028.
 - o USD 25 million earned through carbon financing (REDD+).
 - USD 9.6 million private finance accessed by women-owned
 MSMEs through the CGCC guarantee scheme.
