Community Fisheries Management Plan

Community Fisheries Management Plan shall be prepared in accordance with Article 23 of the Prakas on Community Fisheries Guidelines of the Ministry of Agriculture, Forestry and Fishery (MAFF), based on the information related to the socio-economic status of the people, fisheries, and agriculture, the nature of the fishery involved in fishing, and community issues. Phum Thmei Community Fishery has prepared its three-year plan for 2019-2022. This plan sets out a three-year vision that can contribute to ensure sustainable community development. The community has a vision to improve community living through tourism.

In the community fisheries management plan, there are plans of using fishing gear, patrolling, improving fishing grounds, organizing conservation areas, managing mangrove forests, developing aquaculture, strengthening the capacity of community committee to disseminate relevant fisheries laws and regulations, developing offices and community libraries, and supporting plans for community development.
